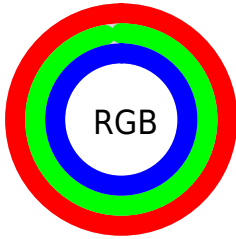

# Details

The CIELCh color 98, 3.820, 337.601 is a light color, and the websafe version is hex FFFFFFFF. A complement of this color would be 99, 3.760, 156.938, and the grayscale version is 98, 0.011, 296.813.

A 20% lighter version of the original color is 100, 0.012, 296.813, and 78, 3.374, 340.150 is the 20% darker color. If you saturate the color by 10%, you get 92, 16.178, 337.998, and if you desaturate by 10%, it is 100, 0.012, 296.813.

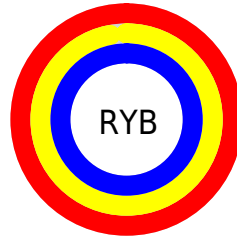

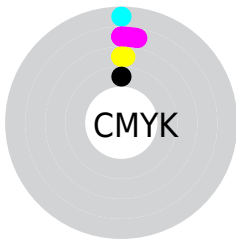

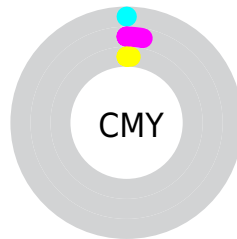

# Brightness & Saturation Gradients


These gradients show how the CIELCh color 98, 3.820, 337.601 changes by changing the brightness by 10 percent. The first figure shows a shift by +10% for each color and the second figure -10%.

Similar to the brightness gradients but the following saturation gradients show a change of the CIELCh color 98, 3.820, 337.601 by changing the saturation by 10% instead.

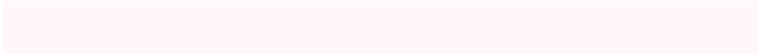

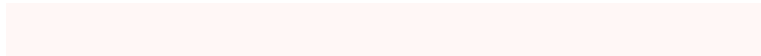

The Rectangle color scheme consists of four colors that form a rectangle on the color wheel.



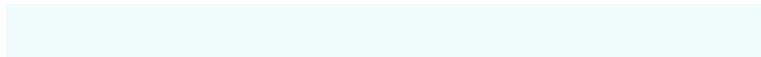

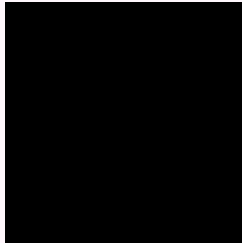

## Text

The CSS property to change the color of the text to CIELCh 98, 3.820, 337.601 is called "color". The color property can be set on classes, ids or directly on the HTML element.

This example shows how text in the color `rgb(255, 247, 252)` looks like.

```
.text, #text, p{  
    color:rgb(255, 247, 252)  
}
```

If you want to add a text shadow in that color use the text-shadow property, you can generate a text shadow directly with our [CSS Text Shadow Generator](#).

Here you see how black text with a 4 pixel rgb(255, 247, 252) colored shadow looks like.

```
.shadow{ text-shadow: 4px 4px 2px rgb(255, 247, 252) }
```

## Border

The CSS property to change the border of an element to CIELCh 98, 3.820, 337.601 is called "border". The border property can be set on classes, ids or directly on the HTML element.

This example shows the color as border, it can be applied via the CSS property "border" or "border-color".

```
.border, #border, table{ border:4px solid rgb(255, 247, 252) }
```

If only the border color should be changed use the property `border-color`.

```
.border{ border-color:rgb(255, 247, 252) }
```

If you want to add a box shadow in that color use:
